On weekends	At 8:00 o'clock	All day

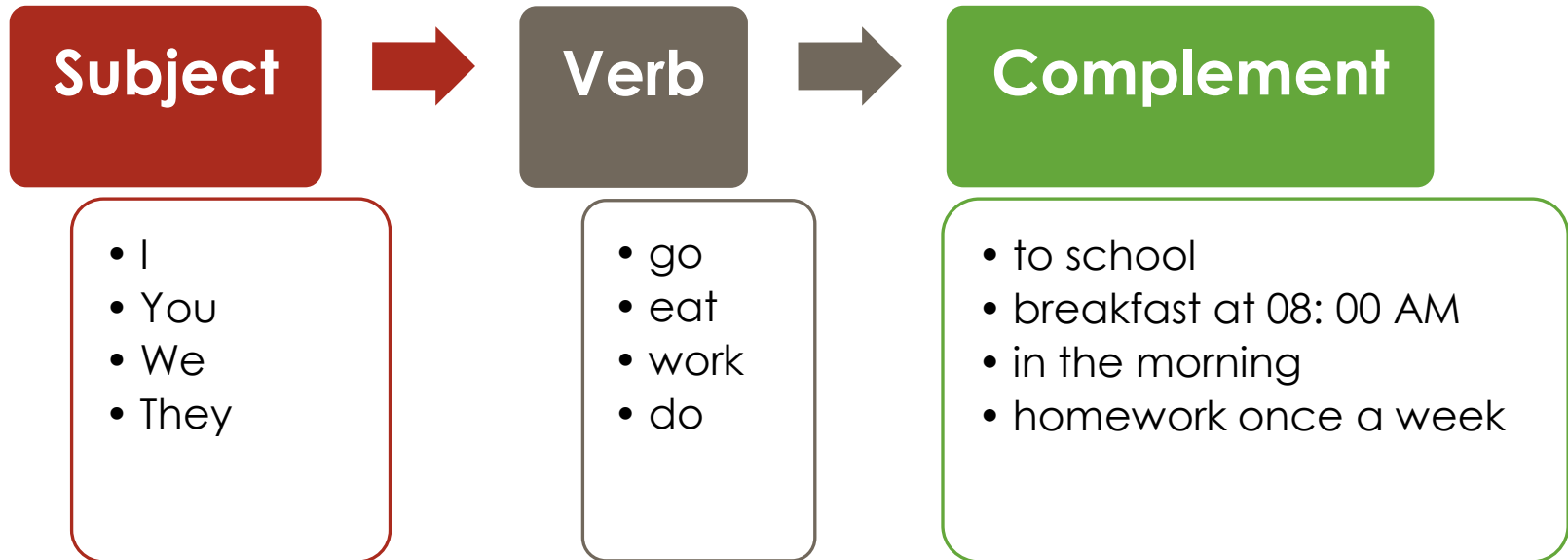

Affirmative Form



Rules for the simple present tense of the third person (He, She, It)

Verbs with s, sh, ch, x, z, o ending, we add **es**: *Kiss – Kisses*, *Wash – Washes*, *Fix – Fixes*, *Go – Goes*

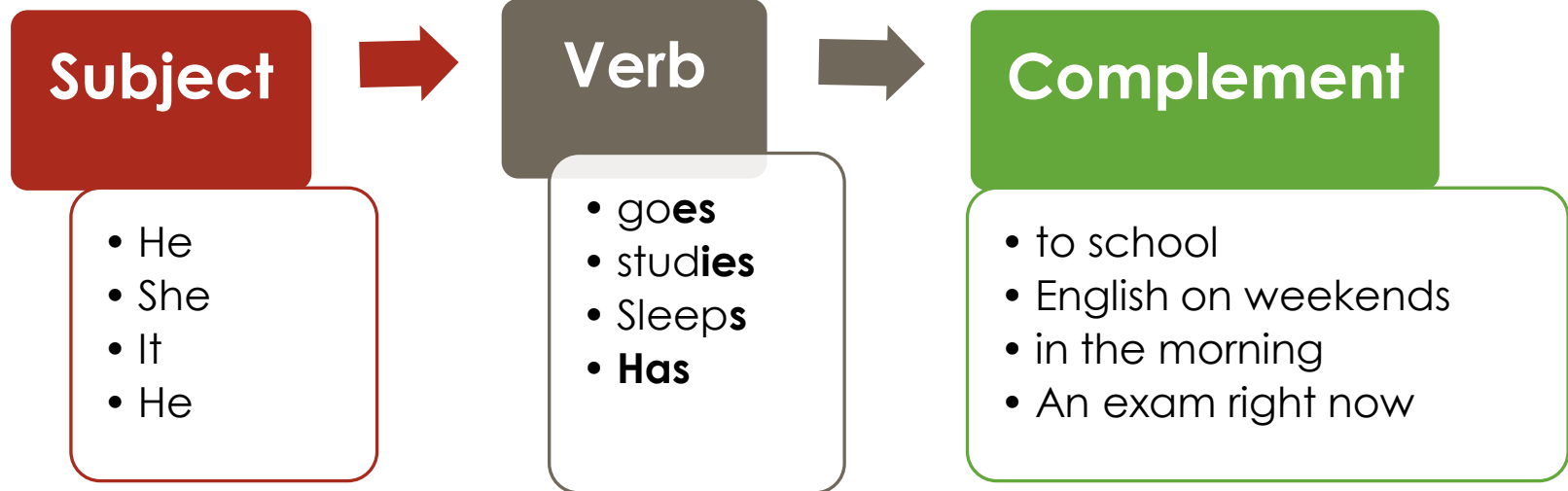
Verbs with consonant + y ending, we eliminate the y and add **ies**: *Study – Studies*, *Fly – Flies*, *Copy – Copies*

Verbs with vowel + y ending, we only add **s**: *Say – Says*, *Play – Plays*, *Buy – Buys*

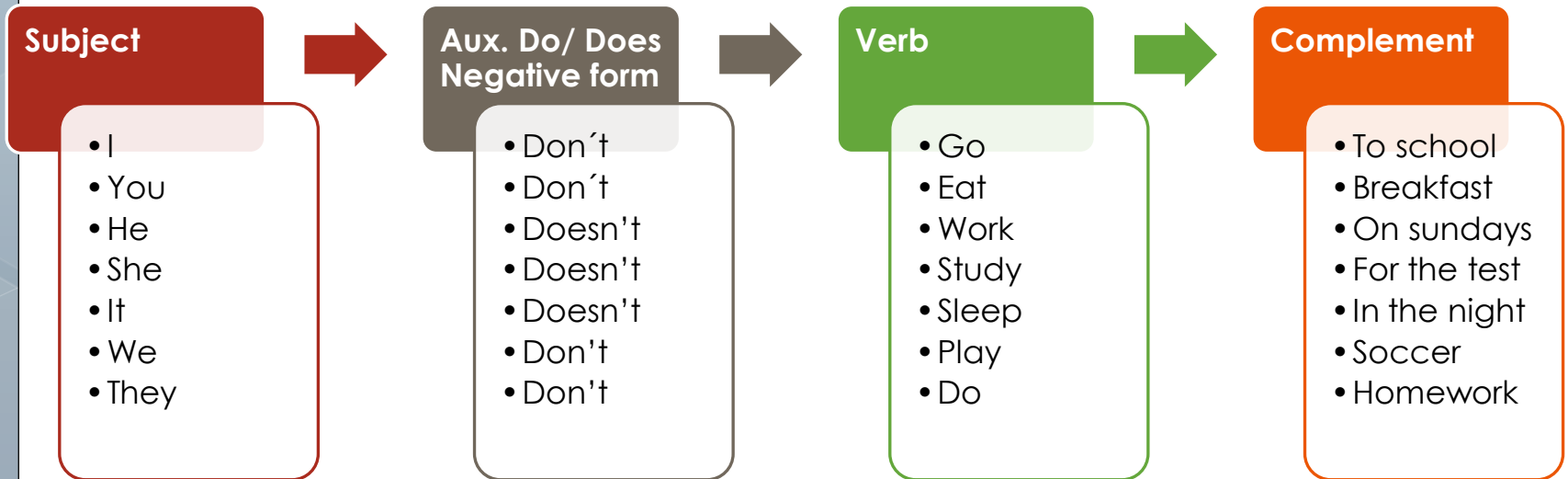
The verb Have is an exception: **Has**

Rest of the endings we add **s**: *Get – Gets*, *Take – Takes*, *Listen – Listens*, *Jump – Jumps*, *Work – Works*, *Read – Reads*, etc.

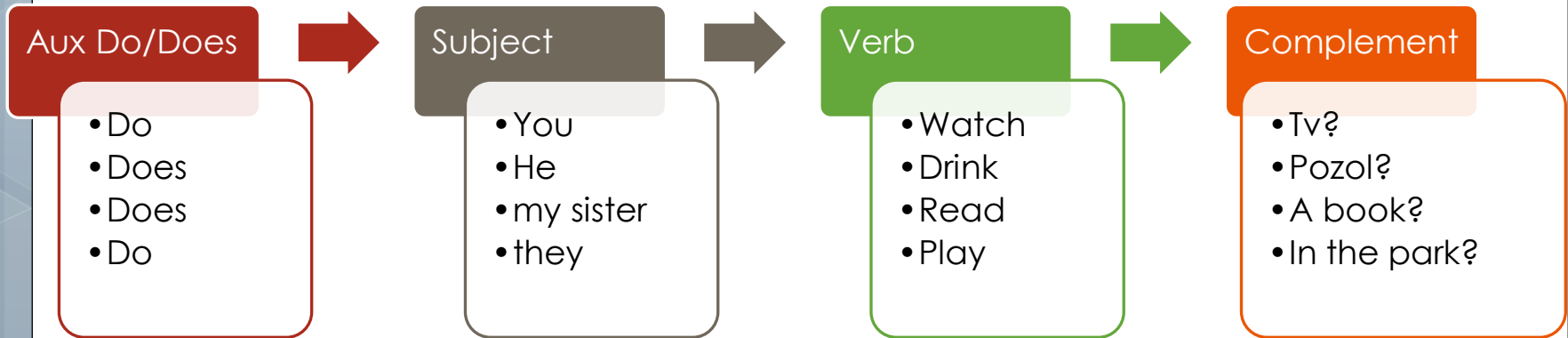
